Note: the entrance to Holiday Marina is on the right side of Hwy 347 - Lanier Islands Parkway, just a few hundred yards BEFORE you get to the Marganitaville (formetry Lake Lanier Islands) entrance, so you will not go thru that or pay a fee. You will pass the pavilion on the right of 347, as you approach the Holiday Marina entrance and guard gate, so make note of it, as that's where you are heading. Stop at the gate in the guest lane and get a parking pass for the pavilion. Make a sharp right and head up the hill. You will see a separate building for restrooms next to the pavilion. Park in a marked parking space nearby.

We were looking forward to a fun and exciting race, but just as the race was getting underway, the initial 10-15 knot winds started to fade along with the early morning sunshine. As the winds gradually slowed a light rain began falling and what had been an adrenaline flowing start soon turned into a wet, light air challenge. As the lead boats rounded the halfway mark at the dam, the struggle to find any wind began. Then as the late starters and slower

boats approached the dam, wind was all but non-existent. The racers waited, bobbing around like rubber ducks in a bathtub, hoping for enough breeze to get them back to the start/finish line. Unfortunately, no such breeze appeared and one racer after another cranked up the iron jenny and motored back to their home ports. Only two of the 22 registered captains were able to finish the race. A special congratulations to Davis MacLeod on winning the Barefoot 2023 Around Alone Race. He combined patience and skill to get his Melges 24 across the finish line on a day when the wind gods abandoned us. A second congratulations goes out to Bo Scott who came in second on his Catalina 22. Awards were given to the two intrepid winning sailors at the dirt-up after the race while the rest of us commiserated while enjoying some food and sodas.

Purser's Update

The club remains in good financial shape. Highlights as of June 13th:

- We have \$6,644 in our checking account, up \$595 since last month.
- We gained \$430 in registrations from the 18 Around Alone racers, which was a big step up from the 11 racers we had in 2022. Hopefully next year we can have that same level of participation plus much better winds!
- We're in the process of updating the permanent trophies for the Joan Holcomb Memorial Women Skippers Regatta. After those engraving costs are covered, we will 50/50 share the remaining event proceeds with LLSC.
- We made a net income of \$56 from merchandise purchased thru our online store and shipped directly. While I am always happy to deliver merchandise in person, I'm also glad we've added the option to ship your items as soon as you buy them!

Upcoming:

- I'm expecting the June 24th Lobster Boil to be a small financial positive for the club, provided we have enough participation to cover the \$400 security fee on top of our food & set-up costs. We must pay at least \$400 per event for Hall County security any time alcohol is present at any of Lanier's marina venues, regardless of whether that alcohol is club-provided or BYOB. This relatively recent requirement has become a major wrinkle in our event planning.
- Our next significant administrative expense is \$324 due July 25th to WIX for our webpage functionality.
