Share the Sail Fleet Charter

Latitudes and Attitudes magazine is organizing a Share the Sail fleet charter to the BVIs November 2-9, 2024. It would be cool if BFSC could fill one or two boats. Fleet charters can be loads of fun, meeting other crews from around the country.

We need to have at least 2 or 3 cabins committed and deposits paid by early March to secure at least one 44' or larger catamaran for this fleet cruise. The cost is \$3000 per person double occupancy in each of the 4 cabins. Single occupancy in a double cabin is an additional \$1,500, although a boat with a single crew cabin might be available without the extra cost. Includes breakfast, lunch, snacks, and a dinner party at the end hosted by



Latitudes and Attitudes. Added costs would include dinners out or on board, alcohol and



airfare and travel insurance (it is late hurricane season). Deposits of \$1000 per person are due by early March.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

The club remains in good financial shape:

As of Jan 6th we had \$6,478 available in our checking account, up \$869 since last month.

- We have \$12,953 available in the Favored End Repair/Replace Savings Account.
- Over the past month we received \$1,125 in income from membership renewals, most via the direct methods (Venmo, Zelle, or personal check) that save our club ~3% card processing fees.
- The Poker Run + Chili Cookoff was a \$153 net expense, as expected. The Purser views this beloved annual tradition as an excellent way to kick off the new year and to re-introduce BFSC to the entire Lake Lanier sailing community rather than a fund-raising event.

We have two upcoming administrative expenses:

- Chubb Insurance due in March 2024; the 2023 premium was \$2,334.
- Georgia Corporate registration due before Apr 1; like last year the fee is \$30.

We're also putting together the budgets for the 2024 season. We're happy with the increased investments we made in the Club Racing program last year, so we're planning to continue that plus budget additional funds for the Cruising program this year.
