ANNUAL AWARDS

At least four club awards are presented annually at the Barefoot Holiday Awards Banquet. These awards are selected by the BFSC board from written nominations submitted by BFSC members. The only criteria for these awards are that the individual submitting the nomination(s) and each nominee must be current BFSC members. If you would like to submit nominations for one or more of the following awards for 2022-2023, please send them to our Yeoman, Linda Hoopes, at (bfscyeoman@gmail.com) no later than Nov. 10.

CREW OF THE YEAR

The Crew of the Year Award recognizes the member who, in a position other than skipper, has contributed to the "success" of the boat/team. The member may have crewed either on racing or cruising boats or both. Crew may have been particularly skilled, dependable or supportive of the skipper's objectives, may have provided consistency or cohesion to the team or may have ensured that gear or provisions were in order, so the skipper could focus on other concerns. The crew may have taken initiative to better her/himself and thereby improved the overall team.

CRUISER OF THE YEAR

The Cruiser of the Year Award recognizes the member who embraces or, by example, personifies noncompetitive sailing (cruising) activities. The member may have organized or participated in local or bluewater cruising events, entertained in a cruising environment, embarked on a cruising lifestyle, provided coaching during cruising events, or derived or imparted joy and/or enthusiasm for cruising events.

SKIPPER OF THE YEAR

Usually nominated by the Racing Captain, but if club members have nominees, please submit. The Skipper of the Year is a member who is skilled at the helm. S/he also demonstrates a great deal of sportsmanship on the water during a race. S/he promotes racing for the betterment of the sport and club participation.

SPARK PLUG AWARD

The Spark Plug Award recognizes the member who has contributed to the success of the club this year. The member may have taken on a special project, organized an activity, volunteered or pitched in when there was a need, or in some way helped the club reach out to its members. The member may have been the catalyst to make things happen or to get something done. Or the member may have "helped" the club by engendering enthusiasm and/or participation in club activities. This member provided a special "spark" that was otherwise missing.

SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

The Sportsmanship Award, awarded by BFSC and submitted for national consideration to US Sailing, recognizes the sailor who has demonstrated a concern and dedication to the betterment of the sport of sailing. This member consistently demonstrates the traits of fair play and sportsmanship, a commitment to individual and collective safety in sailing activities and the on-going development of the sport of sailing.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION AWARDS

There are also *one-of-a-kind* awards... sometimes special recognition or humorous awards. One popular award in the past has been the "Boom Stop" award. Another recent one is the <u>POLYWOG</u> award recognizing the new sailor and/or member whose excitement and enthusiasm for sailing and the sailing community embodies the spirit of the Barefoot Sailing Club. These are fun, and at least mostly tasteful, awards that members personally present.

Several of these awards include perpetual trophies. These are given to the recipients for a year, then collected, engraved with the new recipient names, and handed out at the awards event. **We need a volunteer** to take the awards to an engraver (there is one we've used in the past) once the recipients are finalized, and then make sure they get to the Dec. 3 party for redistribution. Event Report: Lake Lanier Association Shoreline Cleanup



This year's 35th annual shoreline cleanup hosted by Lake Lanier Association was a success. Among the hundreds of volunteers who participated were Barefoot members Lisa, Jack, Laura, Cyndi, and Maria. Volunteers gathered on the cool and cloudless morning of Sept. 23 to later scatter across the lake to collect trash, debris, dock floats, and more. Many worked on land while some worked from boats collecting trash in the water.

Although some volunteers

arrived with water, snacks, or gloves, Lake Lanier Association provided garbage bags, gloves, and t-shirts. The garbage pick-up process was efficient. Some people volunteered to drive to locations once notified by other volunteers who'd compiled the bags of trash and were ready to be collected.

Lake Lanier Association reported collecting "tons" of trash. In fact, they said some volunteers returned to a number of sites the following days to collect trash with heavier equipment. The yearly Shore Sweep event "averages 140,000 pounds of trash and over 1,000 volunteers annually," according to Lake Lanier Association.
