In Memoriam Thomas "Tom" Jay Swendiman

1943-2025

Chief Petty Officer, USNR (ret) Member, SSC 1979-2021 and BFSC, 1999-2025



We are sad to note the passing of Thomas "Tom" J. Swendiman in June of this year after complications set in from surgery in 2024.

Born in Minneapolis, Minnesota, he was predeceased by his parents, Ralph and Betty, and his sister, Jeanne. He is survived by his brothers, John, Trent and Mark, along with several nieces and nephews, whom he loved very much.



Tom enlisted in the U.S. Navy in the 1960s and went on to serve for another 30 years in the U.S. Navy reserves, where he achieved the rank of Chief Petty Officer. Tom graduated from Brenau University with a B.S. degree in 1991 and was awarded membership in Phi Beta Sigma, a scholastic fraternity. Professionally he worked for Western Electric, Southwestern Bell and eventually AT&T, garnering several awards for his outstanding work.


JACQUELINE STEADMAN - Membership Captain

Welcome to the University Yacht Club website. Founded in 1951, UYC is a member of the United States Sailing Association and is listed on the registry of the Yachting Clubs of America. UYC members participate in active power and sailing fleets that are berthed at Club docks. University Yacht Club is located on Lake Lanier in Flowery Branch, Georgia near Atlanta.

Lake Lanier is a man-made lake encompassing 38,000 acres of water and 692 miles of shoreline at normal level. Its maximum depth is 156 feet. Named for poet Sidney Lanier, it was built and is operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The Georgia Department of Natural Resources patrols the lake.

RACING

Barefoot offers major racing circuit events each year, including the annual two-day "Barefoot Open Regatta" on the first weekend in October. The club sponsors a racing series for its PHRF fleets from March through November, with awards to skippers and crew for each series. Regular club races are held on Lake Lanier, featuring both buoy and long-distance (around the islands) racing. The club's sailing instructions detail the rules of racing with Barefoot. Visitors are invited to crew for races; attend the skipper's meeting, held two hours before each race, to see which skippers need crew.

SOCIAL

As its name suggests, the Barefoot Sailing Club is a casual and informal organization, offering a variety of outings and social activities. You will meet interesting folks from all walks of life who have a common interest in sailing. After-race dock parties, raft-ups, fun cruises, and informal gatherings at Sunrise Cove Marina will give you a chance to meet new friends and talk sailing. The club sponsors annual events, including the Blessing of the Fleet party to kick off the racing season, moonlight cruises, a Blue Water Cruise on chartered boats (in Florida or other areas), the annual Lobster Boil, Steak Out, and a Holiday Awards Banquet to close out the year.
